Tips and Tricks for IPAC Success

This course is designed to give you straightforward tips and tricks on IPAC best practices. The focus of this course is to provide up-to-date information on best practices in infection prevention and control based on provincial and national standards, instruction on the practical application of those practices in dental offices, and simple ways to implement these practices. The course also reviews common issues found in dental offices in regulatory and public health unit complaints/investigations and how to avoid them.

Learning Objectives:

1. Review recent changes to provincial and national IPAC standards and what might come next.
 2. Understand the steps involved in IPAC, including disinfection, sterilization, and IPAC documentation.
 3. Learn simple ways to avoid common pitfalls and implement IPAC best practices into the dental practice.
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Dr. Chris Swayze graduated from the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Western Ontario, in 1993; obtained his MBA for Science and Technology from Queen's University in 2000; and in 2012 received the Osgoode Certificate in Health Law from Osgoode Hall Law School. He joined the staff of the Royal College of Dental Surgeons of Ontario (RCDSO), in 2002, where he worked for more than 16 years. While at the RCDSO, Dr. Swayze held numerous positions, including as Manager, Reports, in the Professional Conduct and Regulatory Affairs Department, the RCDSO's Inquires Complaints and Reports process, Quality Assurance, ADR/mediation, discipline, remediation, and on working groups developing guidelines and standards of practice. In 2019, Dr. Swayze left the RCDSO and joined the University of Toronto, Faculty of Dentistry, as Director, Continuing Dental Education. He is a member of the Dean's Senior Leadership Team, on several CSA Group IPAC Standards Committees, including the national standard CAN/CSA Z314 Technical Committee - Medical Device Reprocessing, an examiner and invigilator for the National Dental Examining Board of Canada (NDEB), a member of the International Association for Health Professions Education (AMEE) CPD Committee, and a member of IPAC Canada. He is also a Fellow of The Pierre Fauchard Academy, The American College of Dentists, and The International College of Dentists.

Therapeutic and Cosmetic Botulinum Toxin in Oral Health: Proper Use, Efficacy, and Clinical Pitfalls Learning Objectives

By the end of this session, participants will be able to:

1. Identify appropriate therapeutic and cosmetic indications for botulinum toxin use in oral health practice.
2. Evaluate efficacy and safety considerations, including dosing principles, anatomical accuracy, and patient selection.
3. Recognize common pitfalls and complications associated with botulinum toxin use and apply strategies to prevent adverse outcomes.

Session Summary

Botulinum toxin has become an increasingly utilized adjunct in oral health care for both therapeutic and cosmetic purposes. This session will review evidence-based indications, mechanisms of action, and expected clinical outcomes of botulinum toxin use in dentistry and oral medicine. Emphasis will be placed on proper patient selection, anatomical considerations, realistic outcome expectations, and risk mitigation. Common challenges and complications encountered in clinical practice will be discussed, providing attendees with practical guidance for safe and effective use.

Dr. Elham Emami is a clinician–scientist, Full Professor, and Dean of the Faculty of Dental Medicine and Oral Health Sciences at McGill University. She has a MSc in Prosthodontics and a PhD in Biomedical Science and postdoctoral fellowships in Dental Public Health and Cancer Epidemiology. Dr. Emami has held numerous leadership roles, including service on the CIHR Institute of Musculoskeletal Health and Arthritis Advisory Board and as past president of the IADR e-Oral Health Network. She is the Dentistry Discipline Director on the Board of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences (CAHS). She also serves as a research expert for the Quebec government’s Commissaire à la santé et au bien-être (2025–2028) and has served on the boards of several educational and non-profit organizations. Dr. Emami is the recipient of numerous distinctions, including CIHR Clinician-Scientist Awards I and II. She is a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences, the Académie dentaire du Québec, the American College of Dentists, and the Pierre Fauchard Academy. In 2024, she also received the Prix Mérite from the Conseil interprofessionnel du Québec, awarded by the Ordre des dentistes du Québec.

Dental hygienists dedicated to clinical practice spend the majority of patient treatment time battling biofilm, calculus, and stain. While ultrasonic technology, subgingival air polishing, and hand instruments each have their claims for effectively disrupting and removing hard and soft deposits, the key question remains: when, where and why should each method be used? This session separates science from clever

marketing and explores advantages and limitations of each procedure, inspiring the critical thinking needed to develop individualized debridement strategies for each patient's unique needs. The session will feature live audience polling and clinical demonstrations to reinforce key takeaways and support practical application.

- Examine current research on ultrasonics, supra/subgingival air polishing, and hand instrumentation to determine their respective roles in preventing and treating periodontal disease.
 - Apply evidence-based decision making to select and sequence debridement instruments, magnetostrictive and piezoelectric technologies, and powder formulations to achieve patient-specific clinical results and maximize comfort.
 - Design or enhance biofilm therapy protocols that strengthen overall treatment efficiency, streamline appointment flow and promote professional growth and satisfaction within the dental hygiene team.

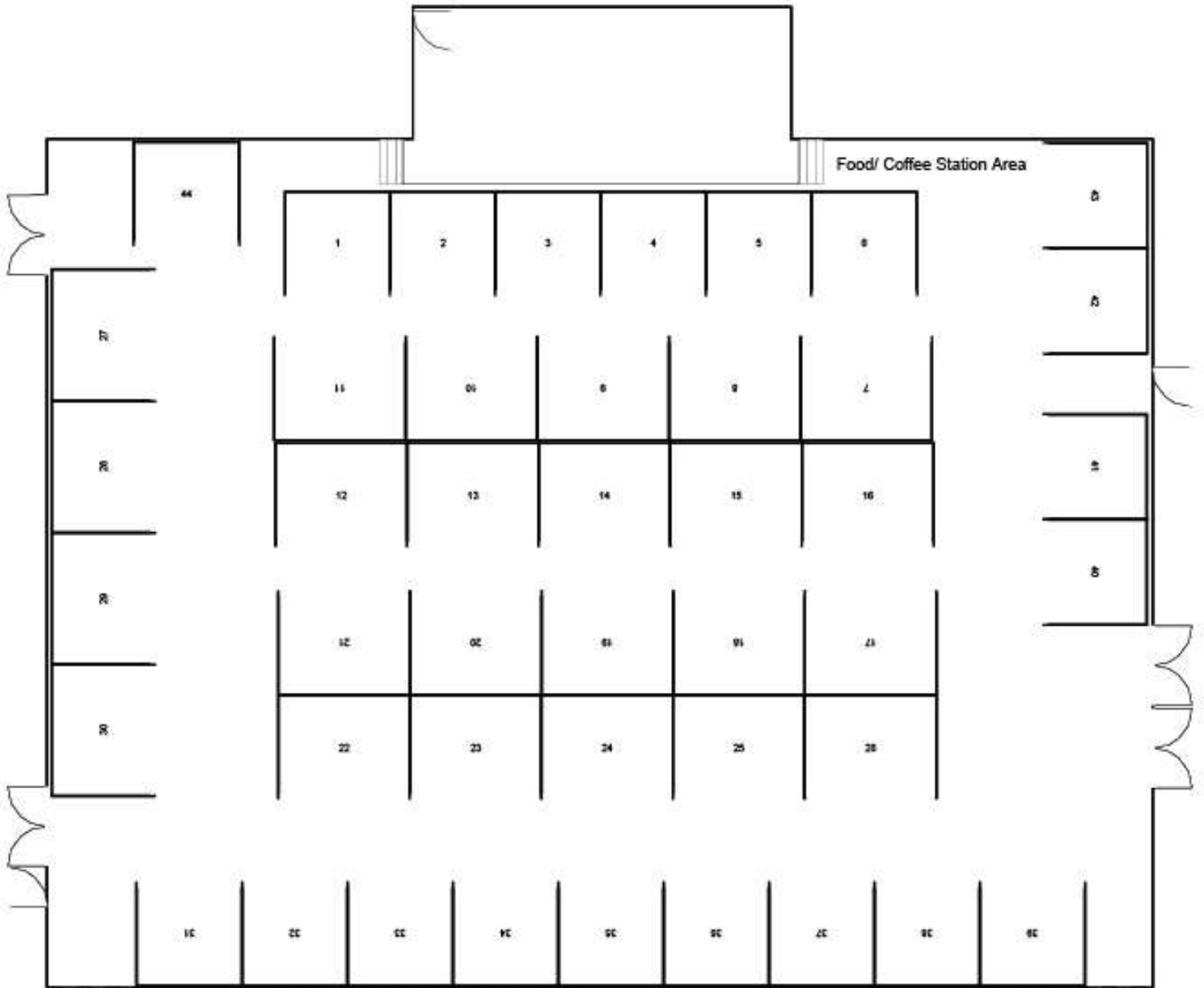
Edward Hollett is Registrar of the Newfoundland and Labrador Dental Board and Treasurer of the Canadian Dental Regulatory Authorities Federation.
